Several years ago the animal shelter decided to close on Sundays. Because this was a great concern to DAWG we worked out an arrangement with the county to allow DAWG to keep the shelter open on Sundays for adoptions only. SOS (Shelter Open Sundays) was born.

Every Sunday since then, there have been at least two DAWG volunteers present, greeting guests and showing dogs and cats—in essence keeping all opportunities available for the precious pets waiting for their forever homes.

Has it been worth it? Well, there aren't adoptions every week, but there are always visitors and that means there's a chance that would have been missed if the shelter was closed.

Following are excerpts from some of the SOS Reports.

- We had 16 visitors today and 2 adoptions. A gentleman looked at Gabby in the big yard. He'll be bringing his brother by to check her out. A family came in and adopted both Laverne and Dutchess. They came in for Dutchess but another daughter was petting Laverne so they got both.
- We had a total of 14 visitors but no adoptions. We had towel, blanket and bed donations. A lady came in for a catch and release cage for feral cats. Another man was looking for a foster home for a pregnant cat that showed up on his doorstep and Karen filled out paperwork. Two ladies put their name on Luigi and on Latte, both of whom are up for adoption soon. All in all, it was a slow beautiful Sunday and the puppies and kitties got a lot of attention.
- The day started out extremely slow, but then things picked up. We had a total of 33 people and 3 adoptions. Spot, the kitten was adopted. Lucky Lady certainly had her lucky day as a very nice lady adopted her and we all feel it will be an excellent home for her. Grover (aka Lover Boy) got his new home. The couple who adopted him had lost their dog 3 years ago and their daughter brought them in to look at dogs today. They were obviously quite taken with Grover. ♥


**My daughter, Hannah, fell in love with Lulu the first time she saw her**

# CAT ADOPTION FOLLOW-UPS



**Arrow:** He's adapted well to his new home. At first, he and the dog were afraid of each other but it's getting better. He sleeps with me and he's doing good.

**Cinnamon:** So far so good. She is my 88-yr-old father's cat. She gets along okay with the 17-yr-old male but has scrapped with the female. They are calming down now. This is the Taj Mahal for cats. My father spoils them.



**Maccia:** He knows his new name Kirky and responds to it. He's lying around with the dogs now. He is very happy with the attention. We will take him to the vet for a check up soon. He has a matted right back leg so we will also take him to the groomer. He sleeps with the dogs

and us. It gets crowded. We are very happy with him and he's not coming back.

**Pumpkin:** Pumpkin, after 10 different trial names is now Halle BooBerry, or simply "Halle." She is very calm around my other pets and all are getting along fine. She must have had dogs in her previous situation since she does not run or hiss at the dogs. Her spay does have an incisional hernia. Hopefully she won't need a third surgery. She doesn't jump up on anything since still healing from her 2 surgeries (her spay and cellulitis revision). She is a purr motor. She is grabby at times with her claws and teeth. I think she is younger than estimated and just needs to learn hands are not toys and this should fade out with training her to take a toy not a hand. She settled in like a champ and just gets cozier every day.



**Bandit:** She is now named Gems. Adopted as an emotional support cat for her grandson. She has taken over the house. She cannot have anything with catnip in it as she goes wild. She has a vet appointment coming up. She just runs the house.

**Kitty Purry:** She's fine. She is healthy but has not been to the vet yet. She lives with two dogs and they are all learning each other's ways. She's doing good.



**Maggie:** She is a terror! Her new name is Melloo, named after a French Boy and Dog story from the adopter's childhood. She keeps jumping up trees and plants in the house. She does not get along with the other cat that well, just a lot of hissing.

I was out of town for a week and my husband who is in a wheelchair had to herd them around himself. With all that energy she has to be healthy. She is sleeping next to me now to recharge for some more adventures.

**Janet:** She's perfect. She eats well, uses the litter box and sleeps in the middle of the bed. I think she's smart. She knows the word "No" and she minds it. She is a blessing.



**Onyx:** He is a wild boy. He climbs on everything and hides in the top shelf of my cabinet. All my friends think he is gorgeous. He has a wonderful home here. He's spoiled rotten and eats like a horse.

**Squeak:** Squeak is now Bella and she has stopped squeaking since she came to us. She is perfect, came out of the cat carrier and took over the house in three hours. She loves laps, greets strangers at the door, loves her new fancy cat box, never messes anything up. She wasn't supposed to sleep with us as my husband has allergies, but I went away for a week and came back to find she'd taken my place in the bed.

# It Takes a Village

It's been said that it takes a village to raise a child. Well, perhaps the same can be said to care for the homeless animals at the Douglas County Animal Shelter. Luckily, between the DAWG members and the Shelter staff, the animals at this Shelter have good lives while waiting for their forever home. The dogs are walked two times daily by DAWG members and are given play time in the yard. The cats are out of their cages and playing with each other while the DAWG members clean their cages, after which they get loved up and socialized.



This is basic, daily care, but it's not all that's done—not by a long shot. A dog named Missy is a good example of just how far we go. Missy came to the Shelter as a stray in February of 2018. She was a wonderful, friendly dog but had some strikes against her. She was black and a pit bull, and didn't get along well with other dogs. But she was an absolute love with all people (including children) and was a pleasure to be around.

Unfortunately, her loving nature was not seen for a long time. Month after month went by and Missy remained at the shelter. **It wasn't until December that someone finally saw the wonderful soul this dog had and took her into their home.**

But did this just happen by chance? Well, chance plays a part in many things but while Missy was at the shelter, the "village" was hard at work. Below is an email sent out after Missy's adoption that exemplifies what is done for all these animals.

On Dec 17, 2018, Leslie Morefield wrote:
